## PROPOSED CDBG PROJECTS

The Town of Duncan is expected to receive \$100,000 in FY 2025 CDBG funds from the Arizona Department of Housing Regional Account (RA). The Town also intends to apply for up to \$1.9 million in Colonias Set Aside CDBG account Funds. CDBG funds must be used to benefit low-income persons and areas, alleviate slum and blight or address urgent need. Based on citizen input as well as local and state planning objectives, potential projects will be selected to be forwarded to the State of Arizona with a request for funding. A public hearing will be held at a Council meeting on February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at 4:00 pm inside Duncan Town Hall, 506 SE Old Hwy Duncan, AZ 85534, to discuss the potential projects. It is expected that the Council will select two projects at this hearing, 1 Regional Account and 1 Colonias CDBG project and adopt applicable resolutions. The potential CDBG projects are as follows:

Safety issues regarding the park in town

Lighting for the park in town

Housing rehab

Handicap accessible parks.

Pledge of Allegiance and prayer: Led by Mayor Blake.

Unanimous.

## 3. Summary of Current Events:

- a. Mayor's Report: Little League sign-ups are starting tonight.
- **b. Council Members Report:** Councilmember Wearne, thank you to all of the employees for all they do. Councilmember Show, HAPPY BIRTHDAY PAM.
- c. Town Manager's Report:
  - Leak in the roof. Turned in claim, but not sure if it will be covered, considering
    the storm did not cause the damage, lack of maintenance is the reason the roof
    is damaged.
  - SMART Grant off to a start. Had a meeting with engineer and ADOT for the roads. Approved WIFA State Parks. Phase 1 – High St. to Main St; Phase 2 – Hunter Estates, tie with direct spending grant, drainage. Phase 3 – rest of the town.
  - Grant from United Way cannot use the United Way money until the contract is signed by state parks.
  - CDBG working on tomorrow council meeting may need to be pushed back or we may have to have a special meeting. We can't bid anything out yet.
  - Ocotillo St. we borrowed a machine from the Town of Clifton. Grading is about 2/3 of the way done.
  - Engineer for the lift station call with ADEQ on Friday.
  - Sewer Rate Study ongoing, no time frame yet.
  - The slide cannot be put up until next year. Although we have the money to pay for it, we cannot pay it until the contract is signed by state parks.

4. Consideration of Resolution 24-01 Authorizing the Mayor to Execute a Water Conservation Grant Fund:

SCADIA SYSTEM AND PIPING - \$395,000 + MONEY WE HAVE RECEIVED FROM FMI, WHICH SHOULD BE ENOUGH MONEY TO COVER.

COUNCILMEMBER SHOW, MAYOR BLAKE AND HINTON – HOUSING REHAB COUNCILMEMBER WEARNE ASKED IF WE NEED IT FOR WASTEWATER. HINTON – THE NEXT RESOLUTION IS FOR WASTEWATER.

STATE PARKS WILL TAKE CARE OF HANDICAP AND OTHER THINGS. CAN NOT USE ON THE LIFT STATION.

The water and sewer stayed the same. Can take care of everything we need. 2 part-time, 3 full-time, 5% for pay increases. \$3,000 to the library, \$3,000 for donations, \$2,000 for misc. Summertime employees. The pool is ready to go. Kept up on chlorine and pumps. May 24<sup>th</sup> is graduation. May 23<sup>rd</sup> is the last day of school. The pool is to open May 27<sup>th</sup>.
